On Sunday, Leo XIV welcomed 159 cyclists from 29 countries at the Giro d'Italia's final stage. He encouraged the athletes "Know you are models for young people around the world. Cycling is important, just as sport is...Thank you for all you do. He applauded their spirit of sacrifice and camaraderie. "Just as you take care of your bodies; may your spirits always be blessed. Attend to the whole person: body, mind, heart, and spirit." His message resonated with the cyclists, who dedicate themselves daily to physical training. He concluded with a blessing. As part of the Jubilee Year of Hope, the gifts and challenges of athleticism imbued with spirit of faith will be celebrated by athletes and enthusiasts in Rome on June 14 - 15, in a range of sporting events, workshops and prayer fostering peace, unity, achievements and holistic development.

PENTECOST AT THE CORE OF OUR LIFE AND MISSION TODAY

How does Pentecost inform our identity and mission? Pentecost reminds us that the Church is not merely a managed institution, but a Spirit-filled movement. The Holy Spirit transformed the apostles' fear and fragmentation into witness and communion, and the crowd became a people with a mission. We are called personally to embrace the Spirit's guidance beyond passive faith and to live in Christ with courage and conviction. Pentecost calls our communities to be Spirit-led to unity and mission.

To what does Pope Leo XIV call the Church? Pope Leo XIV calls the Church to rediscover its source in the Spirit, beyond just conforming to worldly concepts of relevance. His vision emphasizes clarity, courage, conversion, simplicity, contemplation, and imagination, echoing the early disciples' prayer: "Come, Holy Spirit!": the Church is not a mere institution to be managed, but a mystery to be entered.

What is Synodality in itself and what for? Synodality is not an organisational technique for institutional reform but is a practice of listening to the Spirit in the life of the whole Church. To walk together ("syn-hodos") is not merely to hold meetings, but to discern our identity and mission. Synodality, rooted in Pentecost, resists both clericalism and populism. It is not about seizing power but about listening with reverence to all. Discernment is more than just dialogue.

What is Catholic social teaching about? At Pentecost, the Spirit led the apostles not inward, but outward—into a world aching for justice, dignity, and peace. Catholic social teaching is not an add-on to ecclesial life; it is its consequence. To be the Sacrament of Communion, the Church must practice solidarity. In the breaking of the bread, we all are bound to each other across all divisions.

What kind of Church can we be at Regina Caeli? Pope Leo XIV describes the Church not a fortress but as a field hospital, not as a museum of perfection but as a communion of forgiven sinners. To be Church is to burn with the Spirit's fire, to listen in love, and to speak with boldness. Pentecost is not just a past event; it is the permanent condition of the Church. When we forget this, the Church becomes rigid; when synodality ignores this, its openness is restricted; and when social teaching is divorced from this, it becomes ideology.

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs. Second Reading A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead, it is because of sin. But if Christ is in you, then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified.

And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies, through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die. But if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body, you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again. It is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.
