Recently we heard that B'p Ken Howell had been appointed Bishop of Toowoomba after 40 years as a priest & bishop in Brisbane. It will certainly be a change of scene for him as he heads out west. Toowoomba itself isn't far from the capital, but the diocese stretches way out to the state border. So Ken will have some very long drives, not to mention many flights in light aircraft. The diocese was cut off from Brisbane in 1929 when SW Q'ld was going through a boom - not just economically but also ecclesiastically as vocations to the Catholicism of times past, but it still looks to Jesus in a way priesthood & religious life boomed.



A reading from the book of Deuteronomy
