Archbishop Mark has a message for you...
This week I've celebrated my
21st anniversary as a bishop. I've said
to well-wishers that I just wish I knew
21 years ago what I know now. Before he's



made a bishop a man may think he knows all there is to know about episcopal life and ministry. But it's only once you're a bishop that you really learn the ropes. I look back now on my early years as a bishop and cringe at some of the things I said and did. But I like to think I've learnt from my mistakes and am wiser all these years later. Through the 21 years the episcopate itself has changed – in part because of the sex abuse crisis and the journey of the Royal Commission that it brought. But also because of what Pope Francis has brought to the Church, especially in the area of synodality. The Plenary Council in Australia has been a great part of my journey. So too the synods in Rome, past and to come. This has all meant a re-situating of the bishop's ministry, not in a way that undermines it but in a way that shows it for what it is meant to be. The bishop doesn't journey alone but at the heart of the People of God, listening to them as they listen to him, learning from them as they learn from him. On that score,

even after 21 years, I still feel a beginner...

LITURGY OF THE WORD JUNE 25 2023

FIRST READING JEREMIAH 20:10-13

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

He has delivered the soul of the needy

from the hands of those who are evil.

Jeremiah said:

I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side!" Denounce him! Let us denounce him!' All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, 'Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!' SECOND READING ROMANS 5:12-15

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans God's gift to us is nothing like our sin against him. Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all

from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law. Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.
