

In the document, Lamps Ablaze, prepared by A'bp Mark before the Diocesan Summit, in May 2023, Priority 2 is Reshaping Parish Communities...

- 4. What does the term "A Community of Communities" mean in the day to day, Sunday to Sunday parish experience life. It would be helpful if some initial thinking around the above questions was possible before we gather, but is certainly not essential in attending. Everyone is very welcome and all opinions will be noted. Where the conversation leads us will depend on the conversation itself.


