#### **SEASON OF CREATION:**

2023 theme is...

**'LET JUSTICE AND PEACE FLOW!'**The 3rd chapter of Laudato si' is

called...'The Human Roots of the Ecological Crisis.'
This is the most challenging chapter of the encyclical.
It challenges the belief that we are radically separate from and above the non-human world; it challenges the belief which values creation only to the extent that it is useful to humans. (115-118, 122). Pope Francis outlines Catholic social teaching on the common good & recognises the interconnectedness of all of creation

& connects care for creation to the protection of human life & dignity (117, 120, 137).

#### What is Ecological Conversion?

Is Pope Francis' call for an eco-conversion simply a call to recycle more & to cut down on carbon footprints? There is more... St John Paul II encouraged us to embrace the renewal of our relationship with creation so that we no longer see creation as an object to be exploited but as a sacred gift from our Creator to be cherished. Pope Francis calls us to metanoia, i.e. a change of both heart and mind. We are called to rediscover our identity as sons & daughters of our heavenly Father. We have been created in the divine image, commissioned to be stewards of the earth, re-created through the Paschal Mystery of Christ & gifted by the Holy Spirit. Let us respond firstly by an examen of our lives for our actions & failures to act, thus harming God's creation; & secondly, by a commitment of heart, mind & action in our own personal & communal daily lifestyles to promote economic, environmental & social solidarity & sustainability within a more humane economy which considers not only the satisfaction of immediate desires but also the welfare of future generations. Activity: Perhaps during the week, we can try in our own hearts, to have a shift of heart

in how we care for all the environs that we live.

## Gospel Matthew 20: 1-16 A Reading from the Gospel according to Matthew

Why are you jealous because I am generous?

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place & said to them, "You go to my vineyard too & I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour & again at about the ninth hour, he went out & did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us," they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled

"The men who came last," they said, "have done only one hour, & you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat."


He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius?

Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?"
