

St Francis of Assisi

October Saints St Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in Roman Catholic history. He founded the Franciscan orders, incl. the Poor Clares & the lay Third Order. He & St Catherine of Siena are the patron

saints of Italy, & he is also the patron saint of ecology & of animals. Regina Caeli celebrated the culmination of the Season of Creation on the Feast of St Francis of Assisi on Wednesday last with a special Mass. St Francis is quoted to say, 'Start by doing what's necessary;

then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible'.

For Oct 15, Pope Francis is preparing apostolic letter on St Thérèse of Lisieux, the patron saint of missions. Pope Francis stressed that St Thérèse "lived devoted to



God, forgetting about herself, loving & consoling Jesus, & interceding for salvation of all." The 150th anniversary of her birth & the 100th anniversary of her beatification are celebrated this year. St Thérèse of the Child Jesus, also known as the Little Flower, was a Discalced

Carmelite nun. Born in the city of Alençon France in 1873 & died at 24 from TB. Many quotes are attributed to her, including, 'Nothing is insignificant or negligible in the service of God.'



First Reading

Isaiah 5:1-7

A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah

The vineyard of the Lord God of hosts is the House of Israel.

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend has a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower. He dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug, overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah are that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Gospel Matthew 21: 33-43

A Reading from the Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard;



he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son," he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him.

Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them,

'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see? 'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
