The underpinning principle of the Canali Program is that a man in discernment for the seminary and the ordained life is best served by first becoming an active lay minister in a local parish community. With prayer and the sacraments, active participation through lay ministry is essential in providing a foundation for ordained ministry. It informs one's journey of formation and ongoing discernment.

So the program is focused on providing a 'real world' experience in the life of the Church. As the Archdiocese put the final touches on the Seminary Applicants for 2024, we want to encourage you to keep these young men in your prayers so that God can speak to them throughout this discernment process. 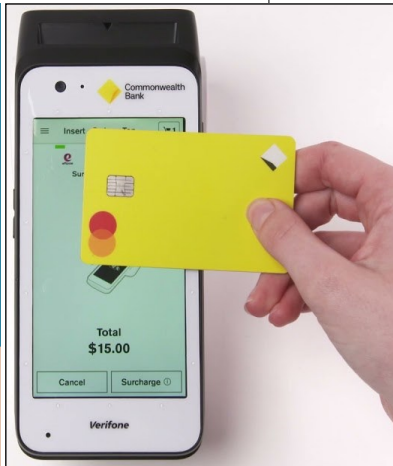
Regina Caeli has introduced a **Pay Pass** facility for donations.

Exodus 22: 20 - 26

A reading from the book of Exodus

*If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan,
my anger will rage against you.*

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. 1 Thessalonians 1: 5 - 10

A reading from the 1st letter of St Paul to Thessalonians

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread - and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us

how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.
