



Archbishop Mark has a message for you...
At the bishops' meeting in Sydney last week,
we asked whether we should say something
about the appalling situation in the Holy

Land. We decided we should; but then the question was what. This is a minefield where you need to tread very carefully, because it seems there is no middle ground. Bishops aren't politicians, diplomats or military leaders: we had to speak a word appropriate for bishops. That meant recognising the humanity of all caught up in the conflict and the injustices all have suffered. It meant recognising that in war blood begets blood & that peace can come only once justice has been done to all. It also meant inviting all people of faith to turn with us to the God who urges us to turn "swords into ploughshares and spears into pruning hooks" (Isaiah 2:4). May the Prince of Peace make that happen in the Holy land he called home.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians *The day of the Lord is going to come like a thief in the night.*You will not be expecting us to write anything to you, brothers, about 'times and seasons,' since you know very well that the Day of the Lord is going to come like a thief in the night. It is when people are saying, 'How quiet and peaceful it is,' that the worst suddenly happens, as suddenly as labour pains come on a pregnant woman; and there will be no way for anybody to evade it.

But it is not as if you live in the dark, my brothers, for that Day to overtake you like a thief.

No, you are all sons of light and sons of the day: we do not belong to the night or to darkness, so we should not go on sleeping, as everyone else does, but stay wide awake and sober.

The master gave talents to his servants. He gave the more talents to the one who was his best servant.

Jesus said that the Kingdom of Heaven was like a great master who was going away. He gave some of his money, called talents, to three of his servants. To his best servant he gave 5 talents, to the next he gave 2 talents and to the last he gave 1 talent. The servants were expected to use their talents. When the master came back he found that the servant with 5 talents had used them well and turned them into 10 talents. The servant who had 2 talents had also used his and turned them into 4 talents. The servant with 1 talent had done nothing with his talent and the master was very unhappy. The master took the talent off the servant and gave it to the one who had 10.
