is a traditional part of The **circle** is a symbol

of eternity & reminder that God has no beginning or end & the inclusion of the evergreens symbolises eternal life. Fastened to the wreath are 4 candles, 3 purple, 1 pink, representing the 4 weeks of Advent. The gradual lighting of all the candles each week represents the increasing light of Christ as his coming draws near & provides a focus for our reflections each week. There is a 5th, & final, candle to be lit. Known as "Christ's candle", this white candle is placed in the middle of the Advent Wreath and lit on Christmas Day to represent the pure light of Jesus, who come on Christmas day as a baby in a manger.

ADVENT WEEK 2: 2nd candle, purple represents PEACE.

Prayer: God of light, send your Holy Spirit upon our

preparations for Christmas. When we worry, are anxious

or feel overwhelmed, help us to seek quiet spaces &

trusted companions who will listen to us. May these

times, places and people of peace remind us that you

come to us to be one of us, with us & for us. Amen.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Prepare the way for the Lord. 'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Second Reading 2 Peter 3:8-14

A reading from the second letter of St Peter We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar

the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up. Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. 
