The Advent Wreath is a traditional part of the Advent season. The circle is a symbol of eternity & reminder that God has no beginning or end & the inclusion of the evergreens symbolises eternal life. Fastened to the wreath are 4 candles, 3 purple, 1 pink, representing the 4 weeks of Advent. The gradual lighting of all the candles each week represents the increasing light of Christ as his coming draws near & provides a focus for our reflections each week. There is a 5th, & final, candle to be lit. Known as "Christ's candle", this white candle is placed in the middle of the Advent Wreath

& lit on Christmas Day to represent the pure light of Jesus, who comes on Christmas day as a baby in a manger. **ADVENT WEEK 3:** The **3rd candle** is pink & represents **JOY**. The change in colour



reminds us that we are at the midpoint of Advent and we are close to Christmas - *the day of Jesus' birth!* 

We take from the reading today...

The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I, is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit & fire. *Luke 3:10-18* **Prayer:** God of power and mercy, open our hearts in welcome. Remove the things that hinder us from receiving Christ with joy so that we may share his love and become one with him when he comes in glory. Amen.

#### John 1:6-8, 19-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered,

'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

> a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you unknown to you the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
