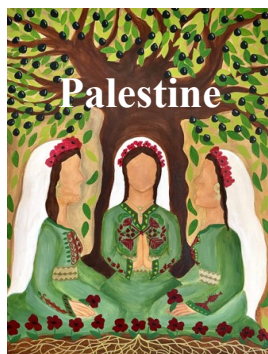

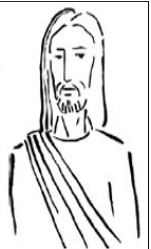
Mark 1:40-45
