This week I've been thinking about an unlikely couple – St Therese of Lisieux and Taylor Swift.

I've been reading parts of St Therese's Story of a Soul, and I've been bombarded by news of Taylor Swift's megatour of Australia. Therese was a Carmelite nun in an obscure convent in the north of France who died at the age of 24 in 1897, but became almost immediately a global sensation, among the most widely loved of all the saints. The phenomenon is mysterious, but Therese connected with all sorts of people in an extraordinary way. However hard it is to explain, that's undeniable. The same is true of Taylor Swift: whatever about her music and promotion, she connects with all sorts of people in an extraordinary and mysterious way. Therese is certainly a saint; Taylor is still a work in progress. But when connection is the name of the game, both young women can teach the rest of us a thing or two. Perhaps I should go to more pop concerts...

Sunday Mass 25 February 2024 THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18

A reading from the book of Genesis The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith. God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.' When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood. Then he stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven, 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.'



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark This is my Son, the beloved; listen to him. Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
